## Rules Governing Show

### GENERAL RULES APPLYING TO BOTH CONTESTS:

1. All animals must be ear notched or ear tagged for identification.
2. All swine must have been farrowed after Dec. 1, 2016.
3. All out-of-state swine must show proof of negative Pseudorabies test within 45 days of show.
4. Show committee will disqualify barrows showing evidence of late castration.
5. No oil or oil-based grooming products will be allowed on animals.
6. Scales will be open but will close at 10am.
7. For additional rules, please see the General Open Livestock Show Rules.
8. Purebred animals may show in breed classes, pending 10 or more entries of the same breed. Registration papers and matching ear notches are mandatory at time of check-in.
9. Please prepare to put 2 pigs in a pen as space may be limited.
10. Trailer parking will be available if you wish to show off the trailer.

### Additional Rules for Madison County Born and Raised Show

- 1.) Barrow or gilt must have been born in Madison County and in possession of the exhibitor by May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018
- 2.) A breeder card will need to be filled out at time of check in with address and phone number of the breeder
- 3.) Any youth exhibitor from age 3 to 21 residing in Madison County may participate.
- 4.) The Honor system should be followed for this show, please be honorable and only enter animals that were born and raised in Madison county. If evidence is reported, the show committee reserves the right to void awarded prizes.

## **Madison County Born and Raised Eligibility Rules**

1. A Madison County sheep producer must have produced lambs.
2. The ewe must be owned by the producer and the project must be lambbed in Madison County.
3. With the exception of breeding season, ewes must be housed in Madison County year-round. Ewes lambing or permanently residing in other counties or states, even if they are owned by a Madison County sheep producer, are not eligible for the county born and raised class.
4. Ewe lambs must have a scrapie tag.
5. Market lambs must have an ear tag that matches the registration form. Market lambs without ear tags will not be registered as a county born and raised project. A scrapie tag with a farm number and individual number are acceptable for identifying both wethers and ewe lambs.
6. The breeder information must be provided on the county born and raised form.
7. Madison County Fair personnel reserve the right to inspect ewes and lambs to verify location, ownership, and existence.
8. Exhibitors wanting to compete in the Madison County Born and Raised show must register for the class at the ShoWorks online entry link as with all other open sheep show entries.
9. **Weight classes:** Will depend upon number of entries.
  - a. Classes may/may not be divided by weights at the discretion of the sheep committee.



## Rules Governing Show

7. All Sheep must be properly tagged with USDA Scrapies approved tag prior to unloading on check in day.
8. Sheep must arrive Sunday morning. Check in and weigh-in will begin promptly at 8:00a.m.
  - a. No blankets allowed on sheep during weigh-ins
9. There will be two divisions of commercial ewes to be shown:
  - a. Commercial ewe lambs
  - b. Commercial yearling ewes
10. Commercial Ewe Lamb classes will be broke by weight based on the numbers entered the day of the show.
11. Commercial Yearling Ewe classes may be split based on the number of entries.
12. Ewe Lambs that show in a commercial ewe lamb class are also eligible to show in the open market classes and will show based on their weight at check-in.
13. All open class sheep are released following the show.

## **OPEN CLASS STEER, HEIFER & FEEDER SHOW**

1. Registration papers will be required for purebred cattle.

2. Breed classes will be formed for heifer classes only if there are three or more of the same breed. If there are not enough purebred cattle to form a breed class, purebred cattle will show in crossbred class, or in an All Other Breed class, if there are three or more various purebred cattle that lack the numbers to form their own breed show.
3. Heifers must be born after Sept. 1, 2017.
4. All cattle will be shown by weight, unless a breed class is formed.
5. Class order: Showmanship, County Born and Raised, Feeders, Heifers and Steers
6. Feeders must be born after Jan. 1, 2019.

## **MADISON COUNTY BORN AND RAISED SHOW**

For the 12th year, the Madison County Born and Raised Class has been added to the 2019 Open Beef Show. The object is to recognize county youth for producing quality market and breeding projects. There is no charge for these classes, however participants need to declare their participation at time of check-in. This will follow showmanship during the Open Class Beef Show on Sunday, July 7, 2019. An overall Champion Born and Raised Market Beef Animal, Champion Born and Raised Heifer, and Champion Born and Raised Feeder Calf will be selected. Various awards will be given to participants.

### **RULES GOVERNING SHOW:**

1. All animals must be current 4-H or FFA projects entered at this year's fair and the animal must have been born and raised in Madison County.
2. Classes will be determined by show management.
