# Support The 2010 Madison County Junior Fair Sale

## Saturday July 17, 2010

### When is the Sale ? What is the Sale Order?

The 2010 Junior Fair Livestock Sale is **ONE DAY ONLY!** The Sale will begin at 10:00 a.m.(registration at 9:00a.m.) on Saturday Morning and end when all of the livestock exhibits have been sold. The Sale Order is as follows: Swine, Dairy (Cheese Trays), Beef and Dairy Feeders, Market Heifers, Market Steers, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Goats. (The Junior Fair Sale will open with the Sale of the Grand Showman of Showman. At the beginning of each species , the Species showman of showman, the species Premier exhibitor , and the Junior Fairboard exhibitors will sell first. )

### How can I buy at the Junior Fair Livestock Sale?

Any individual , groups, organizations, or businesses interested in supporting Madison County Youth at the Livestock Sale, can register on sale day by obtaining a buyer's number from the sale clerk, but remember **Sale starts at 10:00 a.m. NEW! ### When Do I Pay the Bill?

Balance is due upon completion of the sale. All accounts not paid at the sale close are net due 10 days, unless prior arrangements have been made with the Madison County Sale Committee Treasurer. Finance charges are applied to all outstanding accounts after a period of 30 days and are applied at a rate of 2% per/month compounded (prior arrangements may be excluded ). Paying on the day of sale helps the Sales Committee expedite the distribution of checks to 4-H and FFA youth. Payment can be made by cash, check, Visa, Discover, or Mastercard.

### Do I have to take the animal?

**NO!** Many Livestock Buyers want to support the Junior Fair Sale, but have no interest in the animal or the meat. The Sales Committee has prearranged with a Livestock buyer to purchase these animals at market price. The Junior fair Livestock Sale is a premium sale. This means, as a buyer you are only responsible to pay what you bid at the auction block during the sale, unless you have the animal processed for meat. If you are having the animal processed you will be responsible for the Premium Bid and the Market Price of the animal. Junior Fair Exhibitors will receive your premium bid and market price from the livestock buyer.

### I want to have my purchase processed. Where can I have it done?

The Sales Committee has arranged for Delaware Meats to have a truck available to haul livestock to custom slaughter.

**Justin Bauer of Delaware Meats can be reached at: (740) 363-6561 to arrange for butchering.** His charges are as follows:

**Steers:** Kill \$45.00. Processing: \$0.45 per pound hanging weight.

**Hogs:** Kill \$30.00. Processing: \$0.45 per pound of hanging weight. Smoked meat, \$1.30 per pound hanging weight.

**Lambs:** Kill and process \$70.00.

### I bought an animal to be butchered. How much meat can I expect to receive?

#### 1100 Pound Steer

Steaks -170 Pounds  
Roast – 150 Pounds  
Ground Meat – 180 Pounds  
Lesser Cuts – 40 Pounds  
**Total Meat -540 Pounds**

#### 220 Pound Hog

Ham -30 Pounds  
Chops - 32 Pounds  
Shoulder – 18 Pounds  
Bacon – 8 Pounds  
**Total Meat – 136 Pounds**

#### 115 Pound Lamb

Legs and Steaks – 12 Pounds  
Chops – 7 Pounds  
Shoulder Roast – 6 Pounds  
Shanks - 7 Pounds  
**Total Meat – 52 Pounds**
