Dog Exhibitor Dress Code

Exhibitors should be neat, clean, and well-groomed in appearance. They should wear clothing that is comfortable to handle in, and that compliments their dog. Clothing should not hinder or detract from the presentation of the dog.

Exhibitors are not to wear any type of jewelry: earrings, bracelets, watches, or necklaces when showing their dog. Acceptable clothing for girls are dresses, skirts, dress shorts, skorts, dress slacks, , collared button down blouses or polo shirts. . Dresses and skirts must be appropriate length.

attire. dresses and skirts MUST BE fingertip length. Acceptable clothing for bovs includes dress shirts, ties and dress slacks. Sports jackets may be worn, but are not necessary, especially in hot weather. When wearing a tie, it must be secured it with a tie tack. For both boys and girls the following shoes are allowed: Closed-toe shoes, rubber-soled shoes, flats or tennis shoes and similar shoes are acceptable footwear. Shoes not allowed are sandals, flipflops, open toed or open heeled shoes, high or wedge heels or cowboy boots.

- Inappropriate clothing includes clothing that is too tight or too revealing, clothing with holes or tears in the fabric or blue jeans. Do not wear shirts with club names or logos, or clothing with lettering and distracting or offensive wording or designs. Do not wear hats. Exhibitors dressed inappropriately will have points deducted or may be excused from the show ring.
- Dogs must be free of mats and any loose shedding hair. Nails should be trimmed along with the hair on the bottom of their feet. Ears should be clean of any debris. All dogs are to be groomed prior to arriving to the fair. Grooming your dog at the show is prohibited. Intact dogs are allowed to show. However, any female dog who is in season at show time or the vet during the check in exam determines to be in season, will be excused from the show.

PLEASE NOTE: "A" classes in Showmanship and Obedience, are for those exhibitors and dogs who both have no prior show experience. If the exhibitor and/or dog have any prior show experience in showmanship or obedience, then they are to compete in the "B" class. If the exhibitor has competed in any "A" class for You & Your Dog, they are to compete in only "B" classes regardless of age or class level. The only exception is Rally Obedience. An exhibitor can compete in the Rally Novice A class for up to no more than three times before advancing on to the Rally Novice B level and the same to advance to Rally Novice C.
